



The PASR Delaware County Chapter held its Fall Luncheon on November 2, 2016 at Granite Farms Estates. For the first time, the Fall Luncheon became the venue to highlight members singled out for their extraordinary volunteer contribution to our communities, students, the citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the members of PASR. The event emphasized our motto: To serve, not to be served. The Fall Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon was a "Celebration of Service." Awardees received recognition in four areas.

Mary Payne received the Youth Service Award for her efforts with community high school students. As a member for almost 40 years and now as President of the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Xi Chapter, Mary helps develop the potential of 9th- through 12th-graders. Mary and her group mentor males and females, called Xinos and Kudos, and engage the students in monthly community service activities or projects. These activities include sorting supplies and stuffing backpacks for Back-to-School, sorting and packing supplies for Thanksgiving Gift Boxes, and preparing items for Toys-for-Tots Programs. In addition, the youth are involved in letter-writing projects to the military, reading books to children in hospiltal pediatric wards, and entertaining the elderly at area nursing homes.

Margaret Wales received the **Committee Service Award** for the many years of dedicated commitment she gave as the editor of the Chapter Newsletter. Although she resigned from that position, she continues to serve as our Resolutions Chairperson.

UNSETTLED LEGISLATURE INDICATES NEED FOR INVOLVED, INFORMED AND VOCAL CITIZENRY

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE SPRING, 2017

By the time you read this article, the flowers will be blooming and, politically, we will be in a budget battle on the state and federal levels. Demonstrations are the order of the day, and we have not seen this kind of involvement since Kent State or, as some say, Vietnam or the Nixon Era. As far as our organization is concerned, we have a new Executive Director, Mark McKillop, who was instrumental in getting the addresses of those names we received from PSERS under the Right to Know law. We will be using this information to solicit members locally and on the state level.



You may wonder how all of the above affects PASR moving forward. We all need a leader who has organizational experience as well as experience on the "Hill". However, for us as members, it is not an option for any of us to stand on the sideline politically. We all must be more politically active locally as well as nationally.

As we learned already, nationally it has been extremely difficult to get even cabinet appointments approved by the Committee and Senate. Thanks go out to all of us who have voiced our opposition when necessary. Locally, we are moving in the direction of getting away from the archaic way of funding our Public Schools as well as supporting them; Re: Betsy DeVos, barely approved, Secretary of Education. In fact, this appointment was historic! This is why we must continue to be politically active and be willing to express our views locally and nationally. Call your Congressman and Senators as well as your State Representatives and Senators. Tell them you will not allow Public Education to fail or to be privatized! Your voices will be heard--demand to be heard through town meetings, in person or on the phone.

In summary, continue to be vigilant. Let your local and federal representatives know how you feel about all current legislative issues: education, health care, Social Security, Medicare, foreign affairs or whatever affects you.
